





HAI'S EDUCATION INITIATIVES

HAI has taken a significant initiative in bringing world class education programme to India delivered through two of world's leading Hotel Management Schools – the Ecole Hoteliers de Lausanne (Switzerland) and the Hong Kong Polytechnic University School of Hotel and Tourism Management.

Ecole Hoteliers de Lausanne held 4 training modules in 2012-13 on: (i) F&B Profit Maximisation; (ii) Room Revenue Management; (iii) Managing the Training Function; and (iv) Hotel Opening – Soft & Grand.

The Hong Kong Polytechnic University School of Hotel and Tourism Management (SHTM) delivered training modules in 2014 on: (i) Social Media in Hospitality; (ii) Crisis Management in Hospitality and Tourism; and (iii) Evolution of Chinese Tourism Phenomenon: Lessons for India.

These modules were conducted as Certification Programme for Senior Management level executives.


ADOPTION OF HISTORIC NATIONAL MONUMENTS

HAI's public service initiatives prominently feature the plan for Adoption of National Monuments of historical importance for maintenance by member hotels, which would contribute to the enhancement of the local tourist attractions and to the preserving and sustaining of monuments for communities today and for future.

The HAI plan for Adoption of Monuments offers members a wide range of options:

- Hotels can enter into partnership with NCF or INTACH or both for maintenance, cleanliness, illumination, greening, landscaping etc. of any monument under their respective control;
- (ii) INTACH has 35 monuments in 12 Cities where HAI member hotels are also located.
- (iii) NCF has 18 monuments in 11 Cities where HAI member hotels are located.

Dear Shri Jaitley,

I deem it a privilege to convey on behalf of the hospitality industry our confidence and optimism in your dynamic vision in shaping India's new financial policy as a bold, pro-growth Budget for reviving economic growth and creating jobs for India's youth.

The tourism and hospitality industry, as an enabler of inclusive growth, is highly encouraged by your Government's resolve, articulated in the Hon'ble President of India, **Shri Pranab Mukherjee's**, Address to the Joint Session of Parliament on the 9th June 2014 to "build India on our strength of **5-Ts**: Tradition, Talent, **Tourism**, Trade and Technology".

I am therefore availing this opportunity to offer following inputs and perspectives for unlocking the vast potential of hospitality industry to contribute to the national goal of socio-economic growth.

(i) GDP Growth:

Tourism and hospitality sector contributed US\$ 17.74 billion (INR 94,474 crore) to India's GDP in 2012.

The Government has now set a higher target of increasing foreign exchange earnings of tourism during the XIIth Five Year Plan to US\$ 30.30 billion (INR 134,383 crore) by 2016.

Tourism sector's contribution to India's GDP is currently about 6.8%. At the global level, Tourism contributes 9% to the world GDP. Tourism in India has the potential to enhance its contribution to the global level.

(ii) Creating Jobs:

Tourism sector is also one of India's largest creators of employment. It is estimated that 53 million people were employed in tourism jobs in 2010.

For the Twelfth Five Year Plan, Government has set the target of increasing employment in tourism to 77.5 million people, i.e., creating an additional 24.5 million jobs by 2016.

(iii) Infrastructure Development:

Tourists need hotel rooms to stay. India is heavily under-roomed in hotel accommodation, having only 128,771 rooms of standard categories. China, India's peer, has over 10,00,000 hotel rooms.

For the Twelfth Five Year Plan, Government has estimated a requirement of 310,523 hotel rooms by 2016, i.e., an addition of 181,716 hotel rooms by 2016.

For putting in place the infrastructure of additional 181,716 hotel rooms, the hospitality industry requires access to financial resources of the magnitude of INR 200,000 crore. To make this happen, tax incentives and concessions under Section 80 1/A of the Income Tax Act need to be extended to it.

(iv) Imperatives Required:

The tourism and hospitality sector can help achieve the goals of inclusive growth. It requires the following quick reforms:-

- a) Grant of "Infrastructure Status" to hotel industry under Section 80 1/A of Income Tax Act to attract investment in hotel accommodation infrastructure projects;
- Recognition of tourism and hospitality sector as an 'Export Industry' eligible for tax incentives extended on foreign exchange earnings;
- c) Implementation of pending recommendation of National Development Council, made in July 1984, to declare tourism as an "Industry" in the States, making it eligible for availing industrial rates of land, power, water, concessions/ incentives on loans and subsidies.

It is hoped the above suggestions would receive your kind consideration.
