The Judge's Court, until converted into an ITC WelcomHeritage hotel in the 1990's was a private residence constructed at the time when the Raj was at its apex. It is located in a 12 acre orchard in India's' first notified Heritage Village and is easily accessible. It is well connected and situated in the midst of a Temple Circuit that includes Chintpurni, Jwalamukhi, Chamunda Devi, Brajeshwari and the powerful Baglamukhi The Judge's Court is enveloped within "Shakti" – primordial energy. The beautiful Pong Dam is 10 km offering, arguably, India's best birding. With nature walks, ride on the Kangra Valley Narrow Gauge Train, visits to Dharamsala and McLeodganj – abode of His Holiness the Dalai Lama - Pragpur has it all.
